

## **APA Style References (7th Edition)**

## Chapter in an edited book



**Formatting**: Double-space your reference list and use a 0.5 inch hanging indent for each entry.





- **Title of Chapter**: Write the title of the chapter, capitalizing the first word and writing the rest in lowercase. If there is a subtitle, separate it from the main title using a colon (:). Capitalize the first word after the colon and write the rest of the subtitle in lowercase. Follow the title with a period.
- **Editor(s)**: Write the word "In" followed by the first initial(s) and last names of the book's editors. Like author names, multiple editor names are separated by commas and an ampersand (&). Unlike author names, editor names are not written in reverse order. If there is one editor, follow the name with "(Ed.)" and a comma. If there are multiple editors, follow the list of names with "(Eds.)" and a comma.
- **Title of Book**: In italics, write the title of the book, capitalizing the first word and writing the rest in lowercase. Write subtitles as described above.
- **Edition/Volume**: If the book has an edition and/or volume number, include this information in parentheses after the title. Write edition numbers in numerical form without superscript and abbreviate edition (e.g. 2nd ed.). Follow the edition number with a comma and abbreviate volume as well (e.g. 2nd ed., Vol. 4).
- Page Range: Write the chapter's page range in parentheses, starting with "pp." (e.g. pp. 34-54). If the book has an edition and/or volume number, the page range goes after them, in the same set of brackets (e.g. (2nd ed., Vol. 4, pp. 34-54)). Follow the closing bracket with a period.
- **Publisher**: Write the name of the company or organization that published the book, followed by a period.
- **DOI or URL**: If the book has a Digital Object Identifier (DOI), include it in URL format (e.g. https://doi...). If you found the book online, but it does not have a DOI, include the URL instead.
