



# Request an Accessible Version From the Waterloo Library

This option is used to request **accessible digitized library materials** and is only available to **patrons registered with Accessibility Services**.

To submit a request for an accessible PDF, in the **Get It** section of any item's record you will:

- 1 **Scroll down** to the **Links** heading below the Send a digitization request button.
- 2 **Select the Request accessible version** link after the Links heading.

 Based on your request type, either for a physical volume or a digitized section of one, you will receive an **email notification** when the item is ready for pickup, or a **PDF file** will be **emailed** to you once it has been digitized.

2. You are only permitted to receive a single copy of the article/document requested.
3. The article /document you receive via this service will be used by you solely for the purpose of research, private study, education, parody, satire, criticism, review, or news reporting.
4. If the copy is used for the purpose of criticism, review or news reporting, attribution must be given to the source, including the name of the author or creator, if available.
