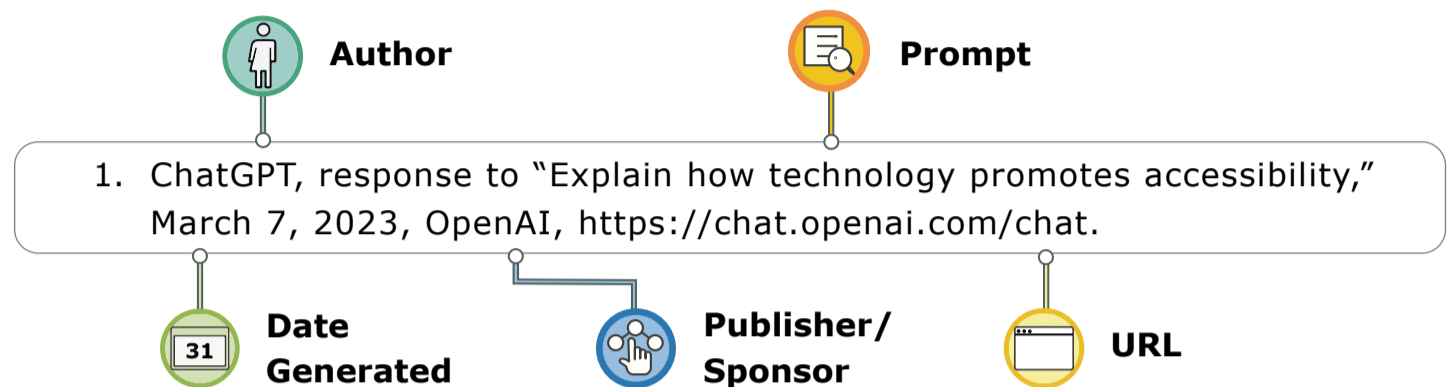


Chicago 17 Manual of Style: References

Artificial Intelligence and ChatBots

NOTES AND BIBLIOGRAPHY

Numbered footnote or endnote:



Author: Use the name of AI, followed by a comma.



Prompt: Include the question asked of the AI within quotation marks. Precede the question with "response to" and follow with a comma.



Date Generated: Specify the date when the text was generated, followed by a comma.



Publisher/Sponsor: Identify the organization that developed the author, followed by a comma.



URL: Add the URL where the AI tool can be found, followed by a period.

In-text (prompt is not included):

1. Text generated by ChatGPT, March 7, 2023, OpenAI, <https://chat.openai.com/chat>.

AUTHOR-DATE

Any information not in the text would be placed in a parenthetical text reference.

(ChatGPT, March 7, 2023).

EDITED TEXT

Chicago notes you must include that you have edited the text generated by AI (e.g., "edited for style and content").

ChatGPT notes that technology helps individuals with disabilities perform tasks that may otherwise be challenging (edited for style and content).

BIBLIOGRAPHY

You do not need to cite ChatGPT in a bibliography or reference list.
